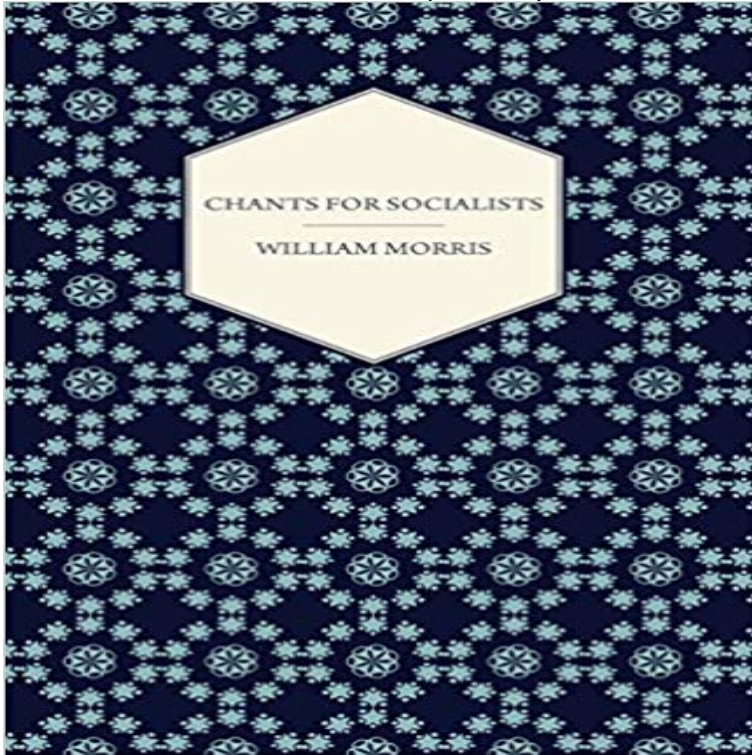


Chants for Socialists (1885)
