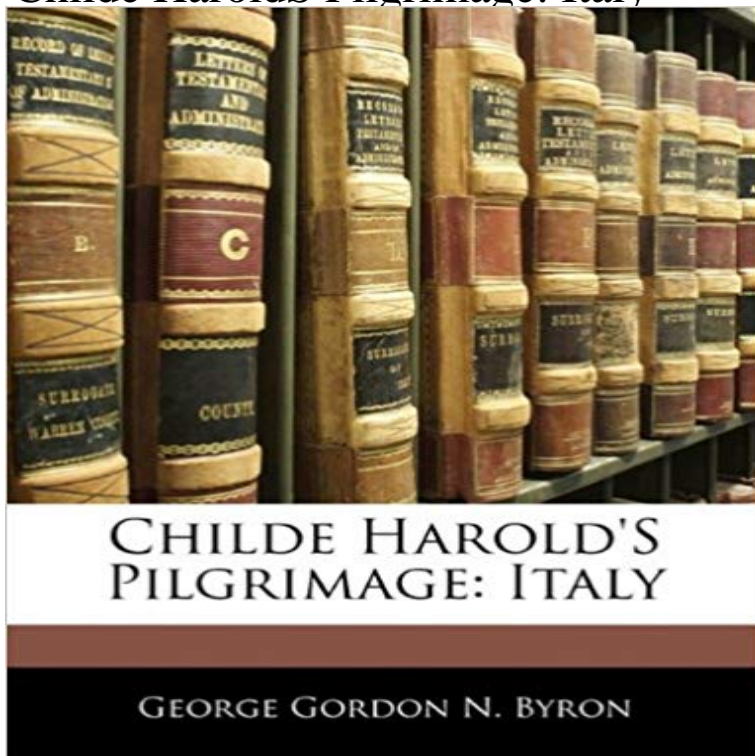


Childe Harold's Pilgrimage: Italy
