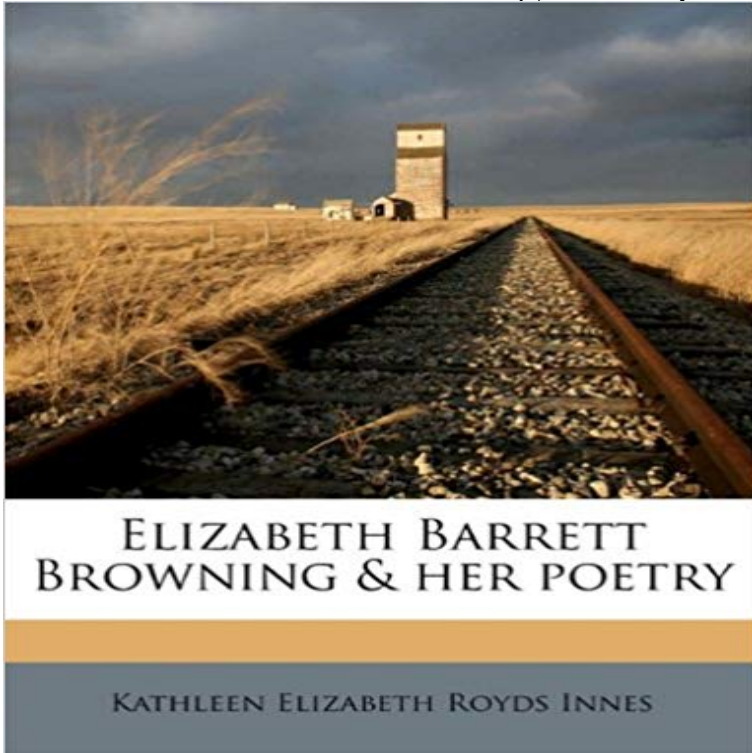


## Elizabeth Barrett Browning & her poetry
