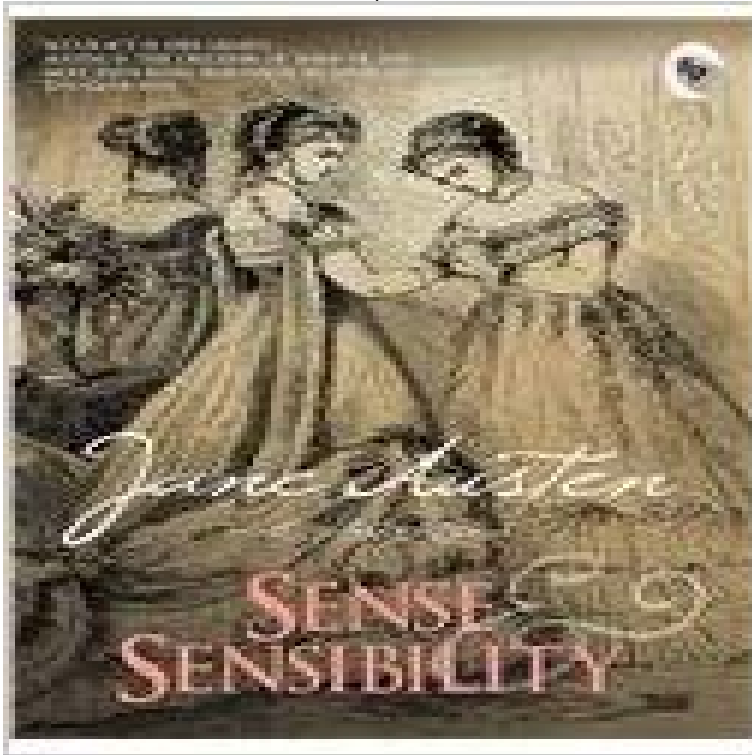


Sense & Sensibility
