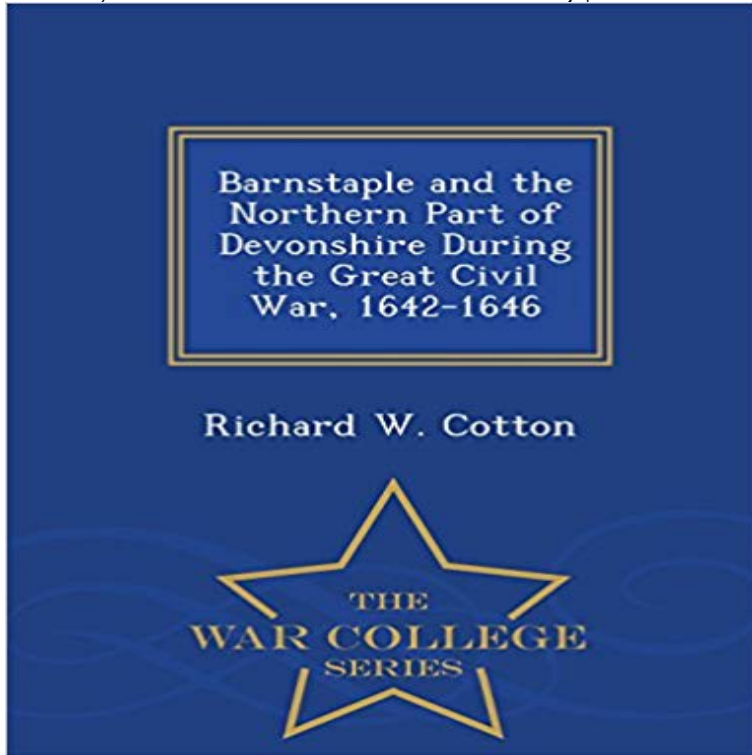


Barnstaple and the Northern Part of Devonshire During the Great Civil War, 1642-1646 - War College Series
