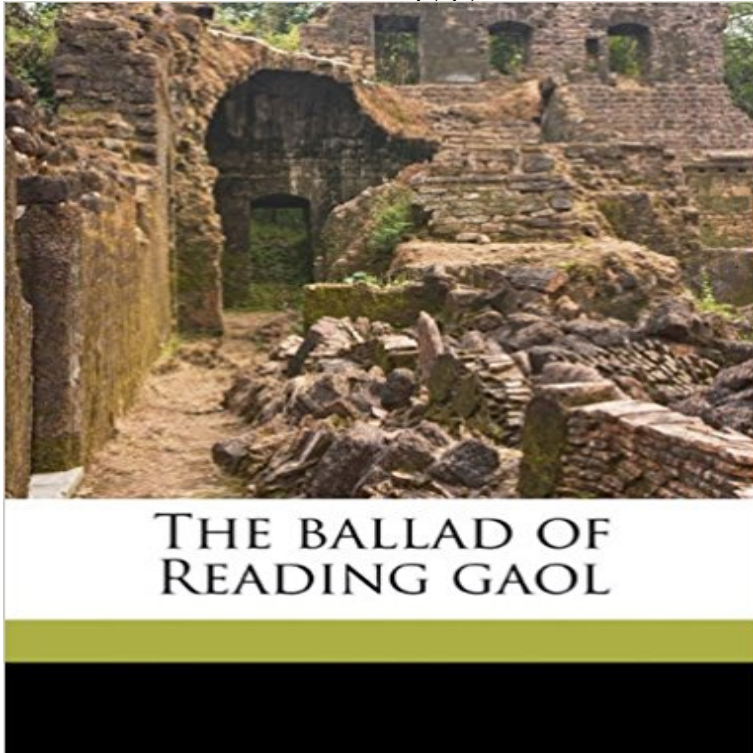


The ballad of Reading gaol
