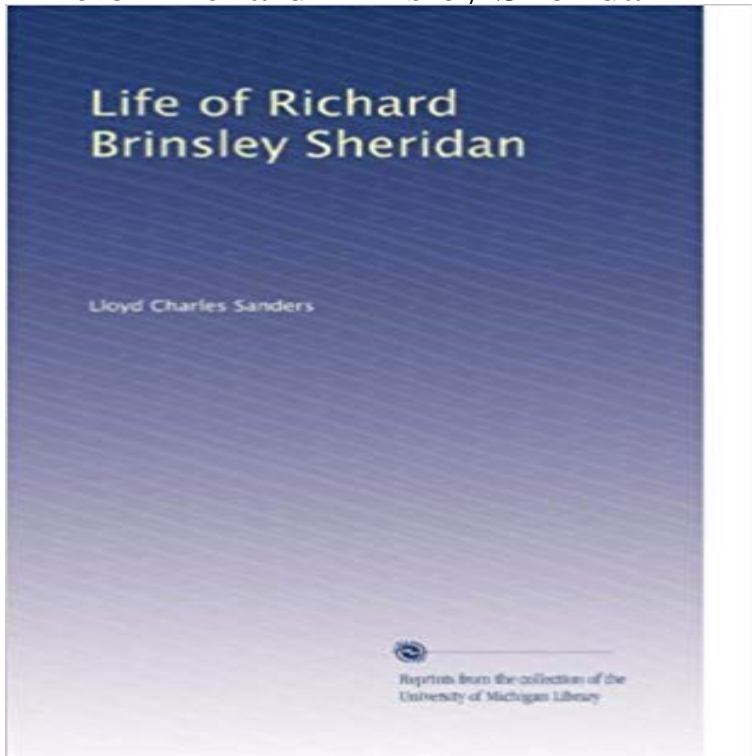


# Life of Richard Brinsley Sheridan
