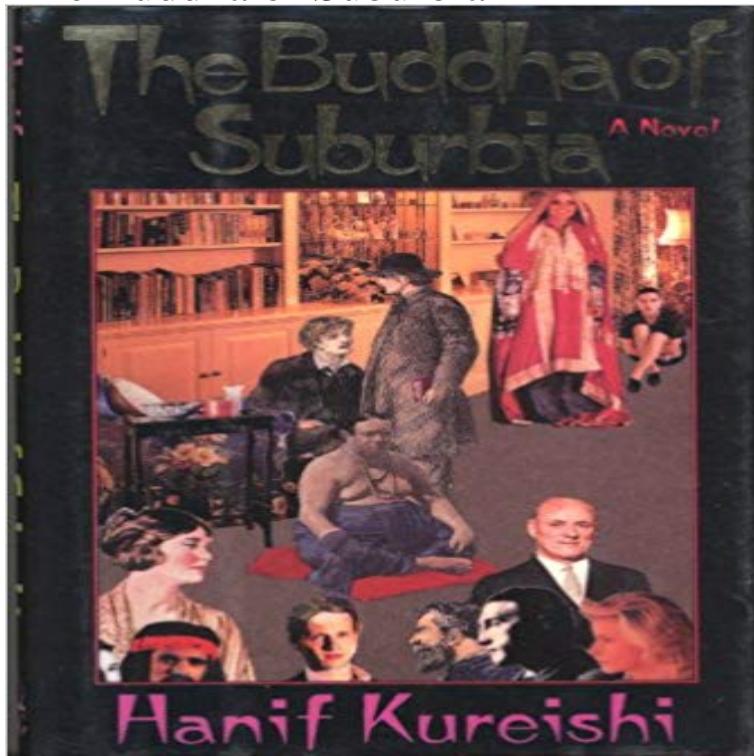


The Buddha of Suburbia
