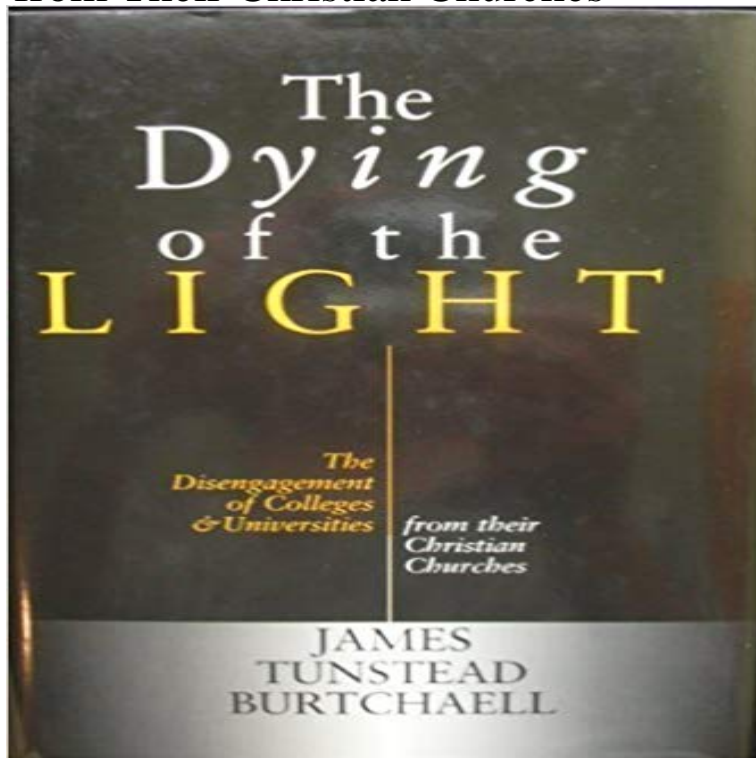


# The Dying of the Light: The Disengagement of Colleges and Universities from Their Christian Churches
