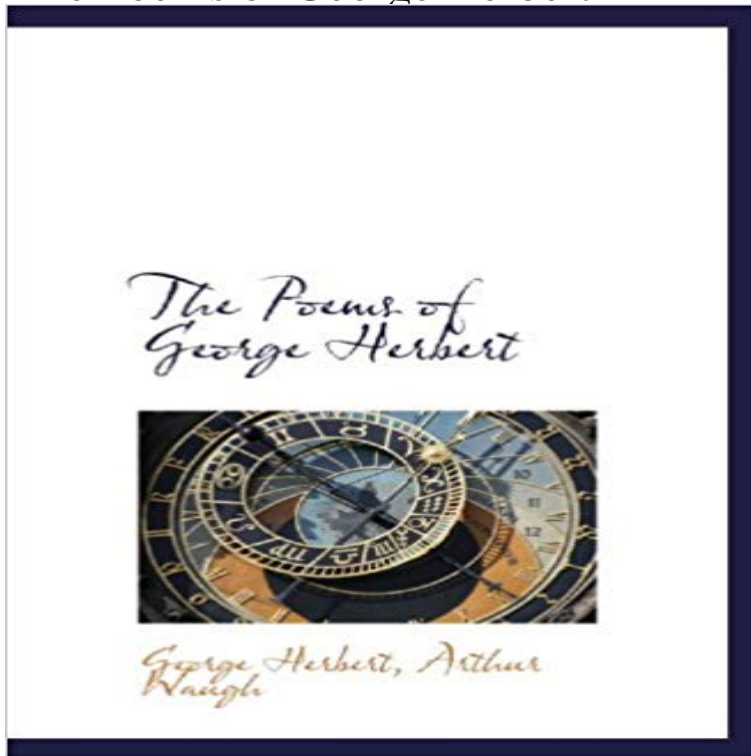


The Poems of George Herbert
