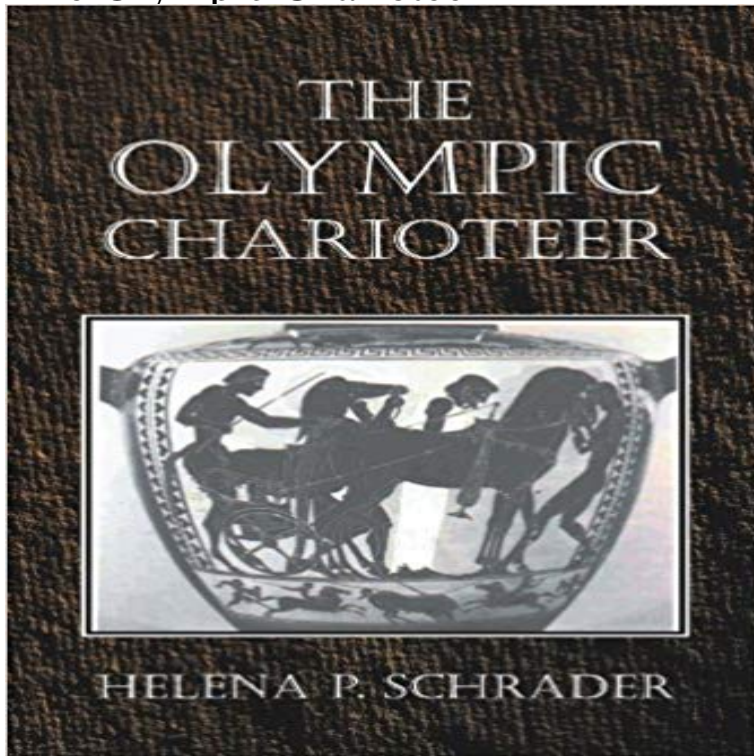


The Olympic Charioteer
