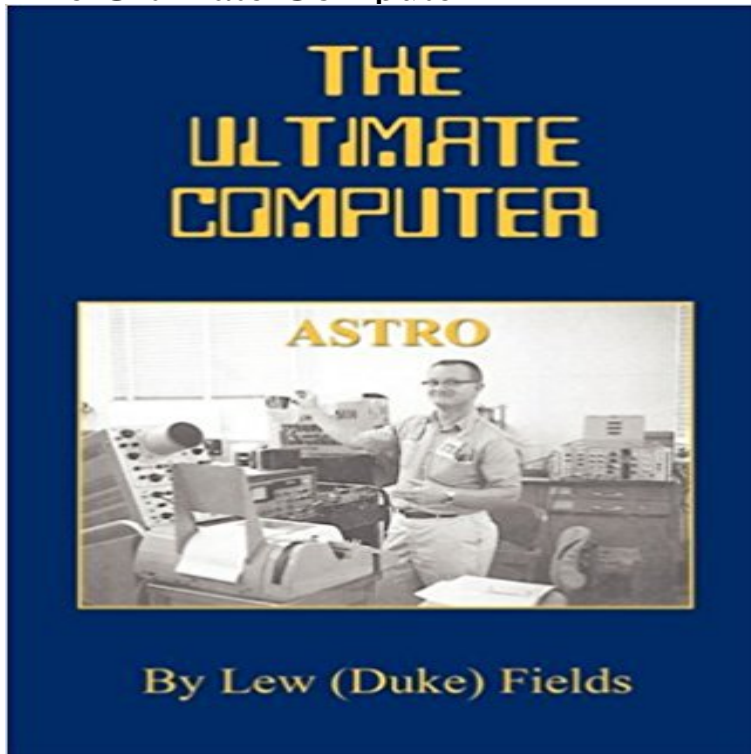


## The Ultimate Computer
