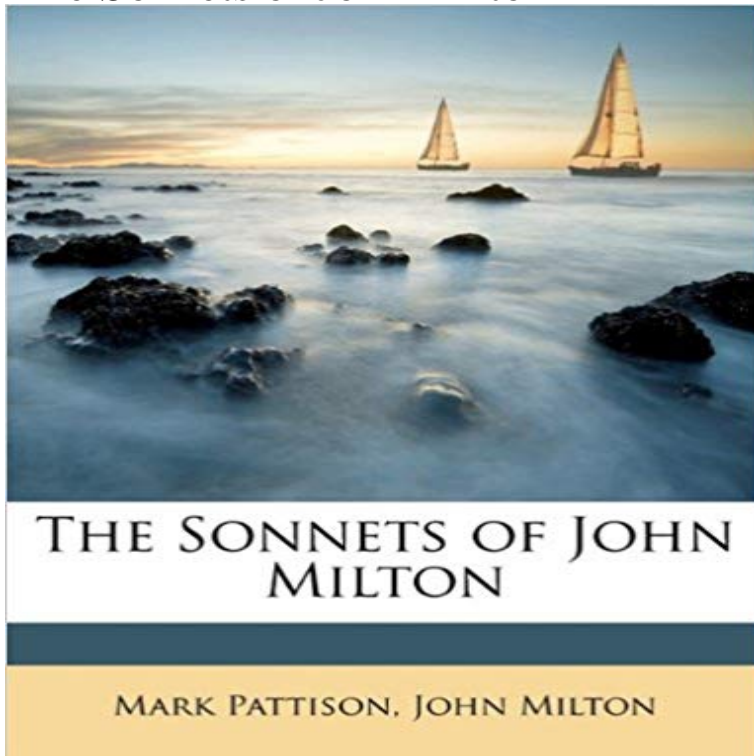


The Sonnets of John Milton
