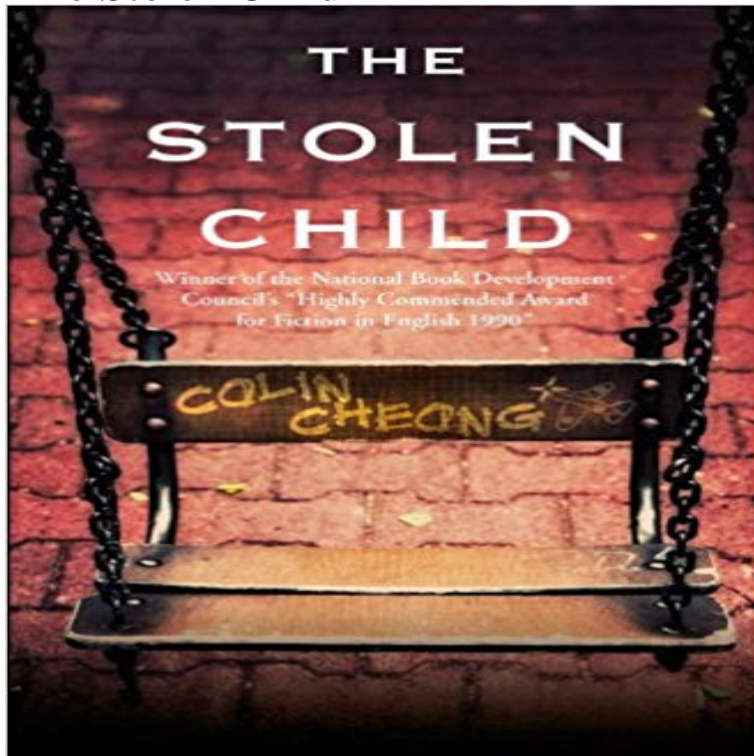


The Stolen Child
