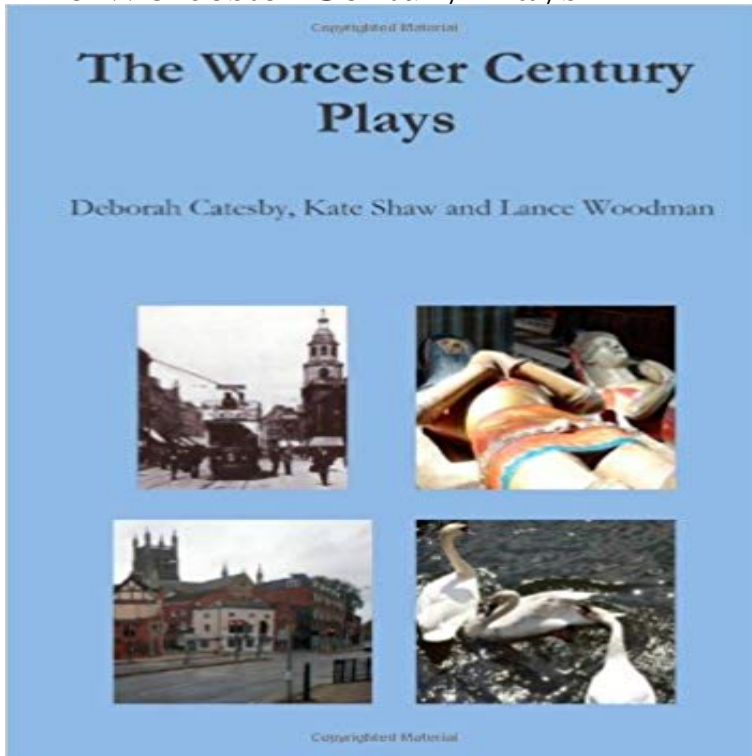


The Worcester Century Plays
