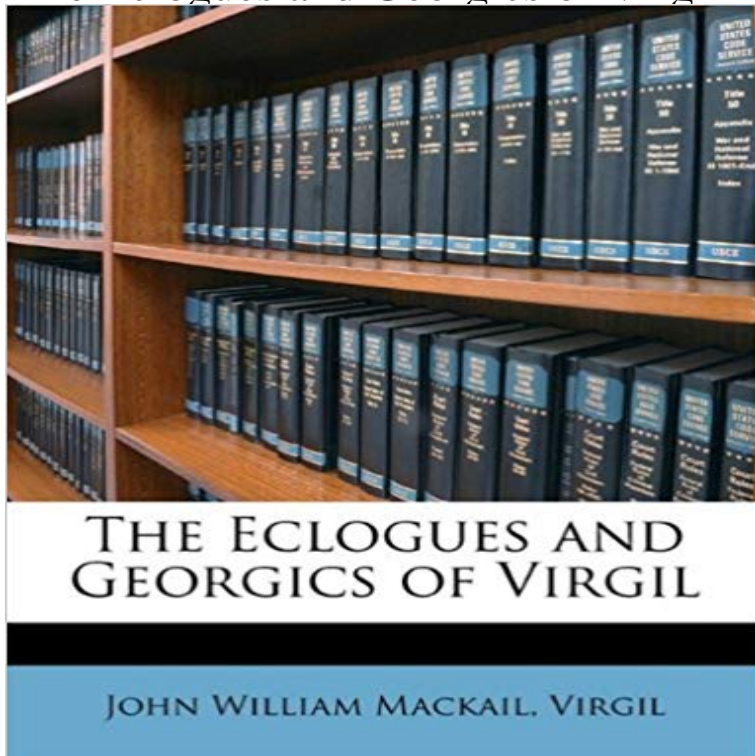


The Eclogues and Georgics of Virgil
